MMF will begin to guide us in this process when we are able to come together again for corporate worship; we pray soon. Until then, we invite you to pray about this idea. The primary ministries we hope to fund through these legacy gifts include "Mission and Ministries" and "Building and Grounds".

white), instant rice, evaporated milk, candy, soap, toilet paper, and anything else you might like to donate.



BES Shelter Volunteering - **FOOD SERVERS NEEDED FOR BETHLEHEM EMERGENCY SHELTER** - We needs 3 people each month to serve the 6:30 seating at BES on 1/9, 2/13, 3/13, and 4/10. One person should be there at @ 5:30 the others at 6:00. No interaction with guests, prepare trays the same and push them through a partition. After the meal, pack food into quart containers and return them to the church, take some home or to

someone in need. Sanitize table tops and chairs, take out trash. NO DISHWASHING as everything will be disposable. You must be 18 or older to volunteer. Gather a crew for one month, or multiple months.

Trex plastics collections:

Although we have suspended Trex plastics collections at the church for the time being, we encourage you to continue to collect your recyclable plastics at home until we can restore our collection program at church.

2, 4; Do More!

Let's hear a Cheer for Trex Challenge plastics recycling! Repeat it three times LOUDLY to solidify in your mind those plastics that can be recycled through our Trex Challenge! Please look for the recycling symbols 2 or 4 where printed on the packaging. Please limit other recycling to items on the following list. The plastics MUST NOT be contaminated with any foreign material or chemicals. The only exception is small paper labels.

Bring your recyclables to church at these times:

- Sundays when we have in-person worship. Deposit your collected plastics in the bin in the vestibule.
- Mondays, 9-3 observe COVID-19 protocols. Ring the front doorbell to be permitted into the building. Please wear your mask and maintain social distancing. Deposit your collected plastics in the bin staged in the Narthex.

In addition to Lucy Thompson and John Kulp, we welcome Deb Spinney to the TREX Plastics Challenge volunteers. If you are interested in this limited commitment project, contact Barb Hendricks for details about how you might support this effort. In the meantime, continue to collect and bring to church the plastics that will help us reach our goal!
