A Word from Pastor Línda Wísser

"In All Things, Love..."

Unlike many people in North America, I have to admit that I am not big on celebrating Valentine's Day. It's not that I am cheap or that I have anything against gifts of flowers or chocolates. It just seems to me, that every day should be a day to show love and to share it.

Some consumer analysts project that Americans are expected to spend 23.9 billion dollars on Valentine's Day this year... 23.9 billion dollars! That's an astounding amount of money. I see this as an indicator of people's desire to love and to be loved (with a little bit of cultural obligation mixed in!).

In worship last week we heard what the Apostle Paul has to say about love. Paul's letter to the early Christian church in Corinth was written to a diverse group of believers who had gifts and resources and ability to show and share Christ's love in a variety of ways. In fact, they were doing a lot. But the conflict and power struggles and confusion caused by an absence of love, made it so that any good they did was hollow, empty. Without love as a foundation and motivation, the work of the church is noise or busyness that bears no fruit, Paul seems to say. It is not a call to further hone gifts or to do more, or sacrifice more, but for the church to practice a 'still more excellent way" (12.31).

Jesus showed and shared this excellent way, with us and with the world that God so loves. It's a love that goes far deeper than feelings, a verb that compels and propels us to service in Christ's name. Throughout this newsletter you will find many ways to worship, learn, serve,

and give as an act of love. Please come and be a part of the ministry at East Hills as we go about doing God's work in the world.

Valentine's Day is February 14th...go ahead and love in every way possible... do it on that day, and the next day, and the day after that, and so on. You get the idea, love...it never ends (13.8)!



JOYFUL NOISE funds can be donated at any time and are used to fill gaps in available food. Most recent purchase was cold cereal. Thanks for your generosity during the past year!



Northeast Community Center: "Because He First Fed Us" we respond with joy to feed others. In her book,

Anita Hinkledey McVey writes that before God created us, "God created a garden. God was preparing a meal for us before we arrived." Jesus demonstrates concern for the food needs of others in feeding the 5,000, and he reminds us that when we feed the least of these, we are feeding Him.

Now is a good time to establish the habit of feeding others by

joining our effort to provide A CAN A WEEK. It's simple to do. Put NECC on your shopping list and purchase just one can every time you shop. There are receptacle baskets in the Narthex which are emptied weekly, and your donations are taken to the foodbank for distribution just a few days later. <u>Drive-By Food Pantry at Central Moravian Church</u> with much needed items for our next food distribution. The drive by is located in Central Moravian Christian Ed parking lot, access road between Kemmerer Museum & God's Acre (follow signs). <u>Sunday, Feb. 6th, 9:30 am -1:00 pm (rain/snow date, Feb. 13th)</u>. Items needed: Boxed (shelf stable) milk, Cereal (sweetened and unsweetened), Flour, Sugar, Chicken soup-any sort, Kidney beans, Tomato paste, Spaghetti sauce, Ground coffee, Tea, Ketchup, Mustard, Spices-any kind, Toilet paper, Soap bars, Wrapped candy, Snack items. We are asking that donations come in paper bags (doubled) or cardboard boxes. Those can

be recycled or repurposed. We will accept donations in any form, but believe plastic is not the best for our environment.
