

Stewards of the Holiday Season

Reflecting on the key points of our recent worship series, "Stewardship: The Life that is Truly Life", I invite us to apply some of those practices as we approach this Christmas season. In terms of our discipleship, one focus of Advent is making a space in our hearts and lives for the Christ to inhabit and grow. How might that look for us as stewards of time, talent, treasure and legacy?

Time: Redeeming our time/reclaiming our time. Isn't it true that time often slips by for us without noticing, especially around the holidays? This Advent, the invitation is to reclaim your time for God's good purpose. Claim an hour for worship on Sundays, claim an hour for private devotions or study in community with us during the Lunch and Learn series, claim time to serve another. Notice how God inhabits those times with you.

Talent: As we share our skills or abilities with others, whether it is cooking or fixing something or helping someone shop or hosting a gathering this season, might we do it with a servant's heart in Jesus' name?

Legacy – How do you pass on the story of Jesus' birth to others? Maybe it's a storybook with children. Maybe it is by bringing friends to experience the Putz? Or an invitation to Christmas Eve worship. Maybe it is by learning more about endowment giving to perpetuate the ministry of East Hills Moravian Church. We are recipients...heirs to a faith we ourselves did not create but rather inherited and called to pass on for others.

Throughout this newsletter, you will discover some ways to Steward the Holiday Season well through participating in the life of Christ's church. Allow His presence to fill your heart and mind to overflowing, such that His love spills out into the world! It is the best gift...ever and always!

Church Flowers




- 1) Enter your name on the Flower Chart (on the bulletin board in the Narthex) on your preferred week.



Afghan Resettlement Update "When God asks, he doesn't ask whose son a person is." -- Afghan proverb

Just last December our new resettlement ministry met Aziza Munji and Esmat Soroush, who fled Afghanistan with their newborn son Rayan when the Taliban seized Kabul. With a great deal of energy, courage, and unfailing cheerfulness as well as all kinds of support from our committee, the family has achieved so much during their first year in the United States. Aziza, Esmat and Rayan are entering 2023 economically independent with a lovely home and many new friends.

An outpouring of kindness and practical assistance helped make this transition possible. People from all BAM churches and the Unitarian Universalist Church of the Lehigh Valley helped with everything including finding, cleaning and setting up their new home; taking care of Rayan during his first times away from his parents and even setting up his first birthday party; supplying diapers, clothing and baby supplies; providing skilled English language tutoring for Esmat; assisting with driving, shopping and doctors' visits; navigating the social services system; researching and enrolling Aziza in college and applying for aid; identifying daycare choices in a difficult market; preparing their first tax return; donating everything from an assortment of treats for their hotel room to a laptop and even a used car; and many, many other large and small acts of kindness and generosity. We're especially grateful to the BAM Ministries Committee for granting seed money to cover six months' rent, and to Sunny Modjadidi, who took the family under his wing as only a fellow Afghan could. We sincerely thank all who were involved.

With one-year-old Rayan now settled in daycare, Aziza is finishing classes needed to apply to a nursing program while Esmat puts his new commercial trucker's license to work as a long-distance hauler. Aziza has asked us to share how much our ministry has meant to her and Esmat. She writes:

"We are deeply thanking Louisa Frey, Carol Grace Hicks, Sunny Modjadidi, Camie Modjadidi, Carole Schachter, Mike DiMenichi, Donna DiMenichi and everyone else who supported us during this one year which was the most critical period of our lives. Leaving your homeland, family and friends and starting from zero in a new country is not easy and reaching here where we are now would be tough and even impossible without your supports and assistance. We are sending our love, courage and respect for all of you unique and kind souls. May God bless you all."

This special family has changed our lives too, inspiring us with their courage, warming us with their hospitality (and many cups of tea!), and enriching us with their friendship. Northeast Community Center:

OUR HELP IS NEEDED at the Northeast Community Center Foodbank. There are great food shortages at this time, especially **MIXED VEGGIES and CARROTS**. Please join in our effort to feed our neighbors by bringing some of these items to church on Sunday. If you have never participated in A CAN A WEEK before, please



consider getting involved now. In addition to a variety of different foods, there is always a need for dish liquid, bath soap, toothpaste, diapers (sizes 2 to 5), as well as grocery bags (plastic, paper, and re-usable). This ministry has been designed to provide an opportunity for all of us to respond to Jesus' command to feed hungry people. *At this time, there is <u>no</u> need for egg cartons.



<u>Drive-By Food Pantry at Central Moravian Church</u> with much needed items for our next food distribution. The drive by is located in Central Moravian Christian Ed parking lot, access road between Kemmerer Museum & God's Acre (follow signs). <u>Sunday, December 4, 2022, from 9:30 a.m. - 1 p.m.</u> Volunteers will be there to receive your donations rain, or shine. Food Pantry items especially needed include: boxed (shelf stable) milk, powdered milk, flour, sugar, rice, jelly, canned tomatoes, spaghetti sauce, ground coffee, ketchup, mustard, cake mixes, spices, toilet paper, infant and adult diapers, soap bars. We are asking that

donations come in paper bags (doubled) or cardboard boxes. Those can be recycled or repurposed.



Moravian Open Door No Room at the Inn Offering.

An Advent Season Gift for Moravian Open Door Each Advent season we are reminded of the family long ago who was homeless, had no room at the inn, and not even a crib for their expected infant. Yet they were provided for. Moravian Open Door (MOD) is a Moravian ministry in New York City that provides a safe, clean, temporary home for up to 40 homeless men and women aged 50 years and older. While the facility (called Moravian House) provides accommodation in single and double rooms, the staff provides supportive services to rebuild

lives and help residents move to affordable permanent housing. During the pandemic of COVID-19, MOD mourned the loss of some of its residents to the virus, and some other residents and even the staff were sickened by the disease and recovered. Keeping everyone safe with extra sanitizing of building areas, providing residents precautionary items such as masks and hand sanitizer, and providing extra food for residents who have lost income has put a great strain on MOD's budget. MOD receives no government funding at all. MOD needs the financial support of Moravian congregations to continue its important service to the homeless. TREX Plastic Challenge Update – BAM Churches – 2022



There is no better time than NOW to bring your recyclable plastics to church. Collections contribute to East Hills' goal of 500 pounds of recycled materials, which will qualify our congregation to receive our THIRD bench. If grocery store bags are no longer a part of your shopping experience, remember that all type 2 and 4 plastics are acceptable. This includes the packaging/wrapping of many grocery items as well as items from online retailers. 
