## A Word from Pastor Linda Wisser

We are now into the season of Summer, a season that has a certain 'feel' to it for many, compared to other seasons. Maybe it's because of the length of the days, the brightness, the warmth, the plans made for summer vacations... many experience summer as a time to relax and to play more than any other season.

In terms of the Christian church calendar, we are now in the season of "Ordinary Time". The church calendar includes two seasons for preparation (Advent and Lent), two seasons of celebration (Christmas and Easter) and 'Ordinary time", a time for action in ministry. Ordinary time is the longest season of the church year, a season that begins at Pentecost (June in 2022) and concludes with the onset of Advent (December in 2022).




# Our 2022 VBS Food Truck Party was a great success! "On A Roll With God"


#### Adult Fellowship outings are resuming!



# Essential News for the PWYCCC (Pay What You Can Community Café)

Several essentials are falling into place and momentum is building for the opening of a new Moravian ministry in Bethlehem.

**Essential:** A Location. West Side Moravian Church has graciously blessed this project and agreed to let the PWYCCC rent the church's parsonage at 418 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue. This location with its socioeconomically diverse neighborhood is a perfect place for all kinds of people to gather for essentials like food and friendship. **Essential:** An Architect. An architect has been retained to draw up plans to give the parsonage a fully

accessible entrance and restroom.

**Essential:** A Name. And now, for the biggest news of all! Instead of using the clumsy list of letters, PWYCCC, we now have a name! We thank the 38 people who submitted 91 name suggestions to the PWYCCC working team and James Joniec for suggesting the name that was finally chosen, **Essentials Café.** We like the layers of meaning this name offers us. Non-Moravians will understand that food and love are essential. And for Moravians, the name also reminds us that in the essential of serving as Christ served, we find unity and purpose.

Which brings us to more Essentials yet to fall into place: Zoning approval, Menu development, furnishings, marketing, and YOU.

**Essential:** Supporters and Volunteers. Become an essential part of the Essentials Café by praying for it and by considering ways you yourself can volunteer or otherwise support this new ministry now and in the months to come.




#### **Friends of Jesus Saves Ministry**

Join us for plastics weighing in the East Classroom on July 10, July 31, Aug. 14, and Aug. 28, immediately following worship. It takes about 15 minutes to "bag and tag" the accumulated plastics in preparation for drop-off to the consolidation site.




