


A Word from Pastor Linda Wisser

Always Thanksgiving



Thanksgiving has long been one of my most favorite holidays. For our (large, extended) family, it is a day of getting together, reconnecting on what's happened since our last get together, sharing good food and wine, and simply relaxing. I look forward to that because it's not something most of us get to do routinely... the slow enjoyment of people and time...that is my Thanksgiving Day experience. Sometimes I think, wouldn't it be great if every day were Thanksgiving?

In the Apostle Paul's letters to early Christians, he often expresses his experience of thanksgiving... not the holiday, but an attitude of the heart postured in wanting people to know Christ. To the Romans, Paul writes, "First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because of your faith proclaimed throughout the world (Romans 2:8). To the church in Corinth, Paul writes, "I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given to you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him..." (1 Corinthians 1:4-5a). To the Ephesians, he writes, "I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason, I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers" (1:15-16). To the Colossians: "In our prayers for you we always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love you have for all the saints" (1:3-4). It seems, for the Apostle Paul, every day was a day of thanksgiving as he saw God at work in the lives of the people and the early Christian church.

I invite us to read through this month's newsletter, with our heart's postured as Paul's seemed to be...inclined for wanting people to know Christ. In this edition of the Star, you will find special worship opportunities such as the Service of Remembrance, Stewardship Covenant Day and Advent Lovefeast. You will receive news about celebrating the success of our Capital Campaign. We see invitations for participation in the Harvest Dinner which helps fund the BAM freezer ministry, and opportunities of blessing through an Angel Tree... and much, much more. All these are invitations, not only for our own growth and development, but that others may come to know Christ. For this reason, my brothers and sisters, I give thanks!

Not only when I gather with my family for Thanksgiving Day, but every day, one of the things I give thanks for.... is all of you. To the church at East Hills, I do not stop giving thanks, because of your faith proclaimed, because of the ways Christ has enriched you, for your love you have for all the saints...I do not stop giving thanks for your work of faith and labor of love and steadfast hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

My prayers of thanksgiving are for you and for all of us as we seek to know Christ and make Him known!

East Hills Moravian Church Contextual Outreach UPDATES:



Dear Friends,

"Who are the people in your neighborhood?" Bob, Sesame Street

Last fall a few folks from East Hills attended a Church Growth and Development workshop on Zoom, which was led by Ben Ingebretson, who serves on staff with the Moravian Church Northern Province. Ben shared ideas for congregations to get to know people who live in close proximity to our churches. Earlier this spring, our Joint Board members and a few others attended 2 Contextual Outreach workshops led by Dr. Jill Peters, Mission Developer at Moravian Theological Seminary. As we slowly and cautiously re-emerge from COVID distancing and isolation, East Hills Moravian Church is actively seeking ways to get to know the people in our neighborhood.

In his presentation, Ben talked about how relationships are established, formed and nurtured. First, we are introduced to someone, or we introduce ourselves. Then we become acquainted with people and conversation happens on a surface level. Beyond acquaintances, comes a relationship and that happens to varying degrees, depending on how the relationship is nurtured. Relationships happen with intentionality.

LET'S GET ACQUAINTED: In the coming months we will begin practicing ways to introduce ourselves to East Hills neighbors and ways to get acquainted with people.

- 1. **TRICK OR TREAT NIGHT**: This Friday, October 29th, is Trick or Treat Night in the neighborhood. Governor Wolf Elementary School will have their Halloween parade and class parties. After school, some East Hills folks will be in the church parking lot to hand out glow sticks and trick or treat tote bags to the children who pass by the church after school. It may seem like a small gesture, and it is, but these kinds of (planned) acts of kindness and hospitality are a way to introduce ourselves to children and families in the area.
- 2. **WEDNESDAY WALKS** through the Neighborhood (Weather permitting): Join me at Noon on Wednesdays in November for a 20-minute walk around the neighborhood over lunch break. It's a time for a little exercise, building our acquaintances and simply observing what's going on around us. Call, email or just show up at the church office by noon on Wednesdays.

As noted in previous newsletters, one of the outcomes of the Contextual Outreach workshops is that the Joint Board is in conversation with Lehigh Valley Children's Centers (LVCC) about establishing a mutually beneficial relationship. Those conversations continue and we hope to share details in the coming months.

Do you have interest in helping East Hills get to know our neighbors? Talk to Pastor Linda or any member of the Joint Board if you want to get involved!


