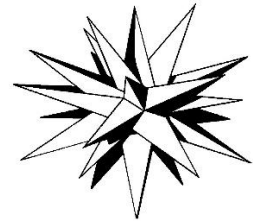

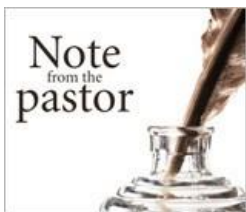

## *A Word from Pastor Linda Wisser*



Who or what it is that guides you and helps you find your way on any given day? Ancient sailors used a lead line. Astronomers used an astrolabe. Scouts use compasses. Modern day drivers use GPS (or paper maps or both). A long-standing practice of Moravian Christians is the use of watchwords as guide, an invitation to read scripture daily and to allow it 'speak' into our lives, as a compass and guide for daily life with God.

The Epiphany narrative in Matthew's gospel (Matthew 2:1-12) tells us that it was a star that guided the journey of the Magi to find the newborn King...God in the flesh! It's a fascinating Bible story that offers us much to ponder and question as we navigate our way into the new year. Wonder with me...

- \* The Magi made their first stop in the big city of Jerusalem. They assumed that they would find Jesus in a place of prominence and importance.... What assumptions do we have about God that we might revisit this new year?
- \* They show up at the wrong place in their search for Jesus... do we look for our salvation in the wrong places? Is there an invitation in this text for us to reorient ourselves to Christ?
- \* When they arrive to Jesus, they present him with, what seems to us, unusual gifts. What unusual gift might you have to offer to God this year?
- \* The Magi came from different regions and made a difficult journey together for a common purpose. Is God calling us to do something with unexpected people in an unknown place this coming year?

\* The Magi showed up, they went to Jesus, they didn't send their gifts via UPS or Fed Ex or camel express... but they determined to show up and get close to Jesus rather than meet him at a distance. Have we been far off, keeping God at a distance? Perhaps God is saying, 'come closer'... 'you will seek me and find me when you search with all your heart'?

\* The wisemen left 'on a different route'. What might God be placing in your heart concerning an unexpected path, a new journey, a different road to travel?

Navigation is a tricky thing. And the terrain of this lifetime is not often easy to tread. But with God as our guide and God's word as a lamp to our feet and light for our path, we indeed can walk each day with a little more joy, confident that we are not lost, and certain that the way of God is the way of life that is truly life.

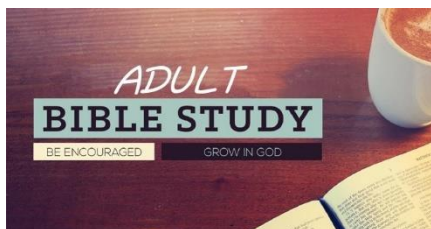

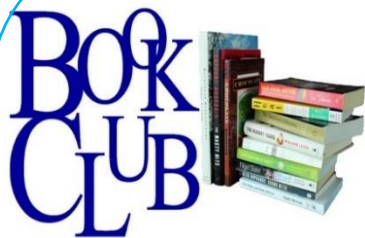


**Update: Bethlehem Area Moravians (BAM) Ministry Committee**

- 2) Call florist - ***Mycalyn's - 610-759-9060*** by the Tuesday prior to your requested date.
- 3) Order flowers, pay florist directly, and have them delivered to the church for the requested date.
- 4) Provide the church office with the date and dedication you would like printed in the bulletin by the Tuesday prior to your requested date. You can fill out the form on the bulletin board and leave it in the basket on the office door, email it, or call the office (610) 868-6481.
- 5) **Take the flowers with you after the service! Please DO NOT leave them in the church. Bring your own vases or wrap them in paper towels. DO NOT TAKE THE FLOWER INSERTS, THEY CANNOT BE REPLACED.** Thank you.

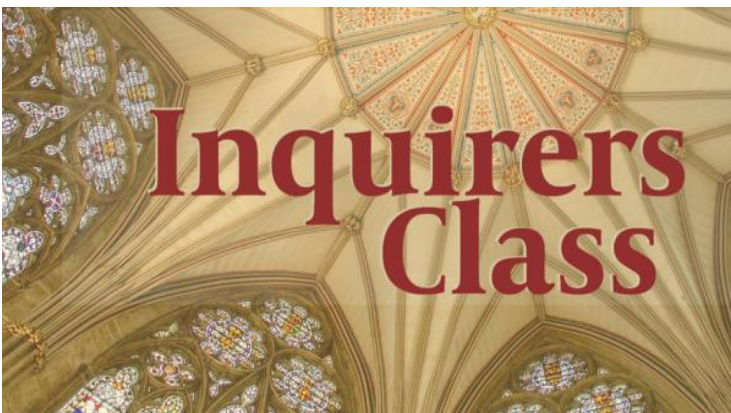


## East Hills Moravian Church Contextual Outreach UPDATES:

**A Can A Week and Joyful Noise** – Both of these important ministries continue to provide much-needed support for the foodbank at the Northeast Community Center. Please watch the weekly announcements and the EHMC Facebook page for updates regarding the most needed items.



### **Northeast Community Center: “Because He First Fed Us”**

we respond with joy to feed others. In her book, Anita Hinkledey McVey writes that before God created us, “God created a garden. God was preparing a meal for us before we arrived.” Jesus demonstrates concern for the food needs of others in feeding the 5,000, and he reminds us that when we feed the least of these, we are feeding Him.

Now is a good time to establish the habit of feeding others by joining our effort to provide A CAN A WEEK. It’s simple to do. Put NECC on your shopping list and purchase just one can every time you shop. There are receptacle baskets in the Narthex which are emptied weekly, and your donations are taken to the foodbank for distribution just a few days later. To help fill the gaps in the most needed foods, watch our weekly announcement in the Thursday email blast or the updates on our EHMC Facebook page. At this time, the most-needed item is cold cereal, but there is always a need for toothpaste, dish liquid, and grocery bags (paper, plastic, and reusable).

Author McVey also says, “The way to make delicious food even better: share it.” We share what we have “Because He First Fed Us.”

**Drive-By Food Pantry at Central Moravian Church** with much needed items for our next food distribution. The drive by is located in Central Moravian Christian Ed parking lot, access road between Kemmerer Museum & God’s Acre (follow signs) from **9:30 am - 1:00 PM January 2nd**. Items needed: Sweetened cereal, sugar, flour, soup of any kind, dried beans (1 lb. size) meal- in-a-can (spaghetti and meatballs/ravioli, beefaroni, etc.), shelf-stable milk (quart size), jelly, ground regular and decaf coffee (12-16 Oz size), tea, ketchup, mustard, cake mix, brownie mix, individual size wrapped candy, toilet paper, infant diapers (size 2, 3, 4, 5). We

are asking that donations come in paper bags (doubled) or cardboard boxes. Those can be recycled or repurposed. We will accept donations in any form, but believe plastic is not the best for our environment.

Six-pack plastic rings  
Pouch packaging  
Cheese wrappers  
Zip lock bags  
Saran Wrap  
Bread wrappers with little air holes  
Cellophane wrappers  
Bird seed or other bulk bags that are not #4  
If material does not stretch easily or is shiny & crinkles or crunches.

**\*\* All plastic must be clean, dry and free of food residue. \*\***

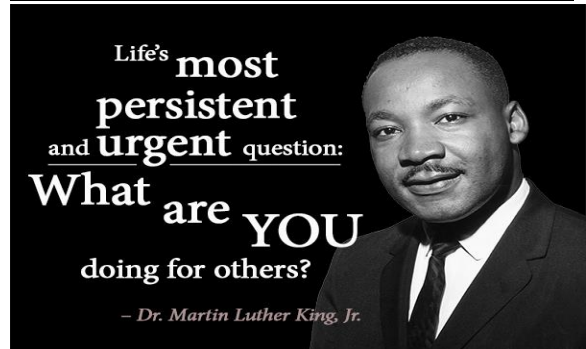
