## A Word from Pastor Linda Wisser:

Soon after their installation, the 2024 EHMC Joint Board met for our Joint Board
Retreat in early February. We reviewed, assessed and celebrated last year's
ministry and established ministry priorities for the new year. Below are some of the highlights of this year's
ministry priorities. We invite your prayers, your support and your participation as we live our mission. "to

ministry priorities. We invite your prayers, your support and your participation as we live our mission, "to Know Christ and to make Him known" and commit ourselves to the new thing God is doing in our midst!

Board of Elders: We seek to engage people (members of the church and others) in worship, study and action. We will continue developing worship services that praise God and inspire people in our life with Jesus, and to offer small group learning opportunities that help people grow in relationship to one another and God. We are exploring partnerships with Governor Wolf Elementary School, our neighbors, Bethlehem Parks program, Center for Humanistic Change, North Bethlehem Little League, and United Way Senior Hub programs, to establish relationships, help strengthen, nurture and care for the people and this area that is home for all of us, and so that East Hills becomes known and associated with what is good in the neighborhood! We plan to create a new digital pictorial directory as well, which will involve reaching out to all church members and asking you all to send us your photos! Watch for more information on this!

Board of Trustees: We have identified these priorities for the year ahead: to make progress on projects such as the courtyard, signage, exterior doors, upgrades to the lower level and main bathrooms in ways that leverage grants; to educate and encourage people regarding the Endowment Fund and opportunities to include EHMC in our estate planning; to address building security as relates to access (keys/keypad entry) and monitoring activity. We also recognize the tremendous recent growth of the Freezer Ministry and have established a team to review current structure, and to discern together the structure needed so that this ministry can continue to thrive into the future. Communication is another area our Trustees are working on to develop a modern strategy to effectively communicate to and with members of the church and beyond.

As we approach Holy Week this month, our hearts and minds are reminded of the pain and brokenness in our human lives. But we also know that's not how our story ends. We look to the Resurrection reality, our Risen Lord, and the new life that is possible in Him. It is, indeed, life that heals and transforms every kind of pain and brokenness. Isn't it quite incredible (and humbling) to see how God works through the church, through us, to help make that healing and transformation occur?

We offer thanks to all those who serve in the name of Jesus, and look ahead with anticipation of what God is up to in our world! Anticipating the new thing God is doing among us.


