

"Following Jesus Faithfully"

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:18). These words come at the very end of Matthew's Gospel just verses after the account of Jesus' Resurrection on Easter morning and mark the handoff of the Savior's earthly ministry to the disciples he has taught and trained. Jesus' words embody both the church's purpose and its marching orders. They are the inspiration behind our congregation's mission statement:

"To Know Christ and Make Him Known."

Beginning October 13, we will start a six-week worship series exploring how each of us can better fulfill our role as a disciple of Jesus Christ. Hymns, special sharing, selection of scriptures, and the sermon will all focus on a sequence of six words which we believe can help guide our spiritual growth in practical, tangible ways.

- We believe that Christ wants each of us to live a richly fulfilling life, transformed and constantly renewed by the inflowing of God's grace. On the first Sunday we will explore how that is possible in these busy, fractured times and find inspiration for how to receive and share God's blessings.
- We will then explore the importance of gathering together with other committed Christians in an age of growing unbelief, loneliness, and social isolation. Themes of gathering and connecting will occupy the second two Sundays. We will learn how other members of the congregation have drawn strength and insight from their interaction with each other.
- As we move into the latter half of our series, our focus will shift from ourselves to the important
 work which Jesus asks us to continue on his behalf. We will see how serving in Christ's name
 changes the world and provides hope for a better future and learn how our financial giving not
 only makes the work of the church possible, but also holds its own intrinsic blessing as it teaches us
 to trust God.
- Finally, we will embrace the task of sharing the good news with others through invitation and example.

Highlights of the series include a service of Holy Communion on November 10 and a Cup of Covenant service on November 17. The latter will provide each of us the occasion to renew our baptismal vows "to participate actively in Christ's church, serving God all the days of our lives."

Bethlehem Emergency Shelter (BES) News

It's time to start thinking about East Hill's commitments to staff one night per month at BES. We will again be hosting on the **second Saturday evening** of each month. Those dates are: 12/14/19, 1/11/20, 2/8/20, and 3/14/20.

The needs are as follows:

- **<u>Registration</u>**: 4:30-7:15 pm (2-3 people) and 7:15-10:00 pm (2 people). Greet and register guests; assist filling out information logs, escort new guests to sleeping area.
- <u>Late Kitchen Service/Socialization</u>: 7:30-9:45 pm (2-3 people). Serve reheated dinners to late arrivals, put out snacks and beverages for guests socializing in the dining room, provide OTC medications as requested by guests, clean kitchen and dining areas after guests retire to sleeping areas at 9:45 pm.
- Male and Female Overnight Chaperones: (1 each). Sleep in hallway outside men's or women's sleeping area. Cot provided; bring own pillow and bedding.

There will be paid onsite managers from open to close for all general supervision and any interventions needed. All guests will have been pre-screened by the BAPD and will show Police Vouchers in order to enter initially.

There will be informational/instructional meetings scheduled for October and all who plan to volunteer are encouraged to go. Dates have not yet been set by BES. A Note From Your Treasurer

In last month's note, I said that one of the things I like about the Moravian Church is its form of governance. I like the fact that being congregational in style, decisions impacting our church are made by its members. The Boards of Elders and Trustees have specific responsibilities, but these are generally within parameters set by its Church Council. The members of our church have both the opportunity and responsibility to get involved and have direct impact on our shared ministry. This is in fact our calling as church members.

At the Men's Fellowship gathering on the evening of Wednesday, September 18, I was reminded in our study of Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians that "there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone... ... for the common good." It never ceases to amaze and delight me when I see the positive impacts that result as members of our church respond to these callings.

As a case in point, I can reflect on the situation with our Preschool. In late 2018, members of the Advisory Board used their gifts of knowledge to identify the trajectory of Preschool enrollments and the potential for significant negative impacts on the students, their families and our church. In early 2019, the Joint Board and members of the congregation used their gifts of wisdom to dig deeper into the underlying causes and Church Council used their collective gift of faith to challenge us all to find a way to move forward. Gifts of knowledge, wisdom, faith and healing (and perhaps also the working of miracles) have all come together to embolden the action needed to allow our Preschool to continue for another year. I have only heard positive reports about the results of this process.

There are numerous other stories to be told where the varieties of gifts provided by God, called by Jesus, and inspired by the Spirit are deployed in support of our mission. In fact, there are stories involving every ministry and every member of our church. This is what I love about our church. Together, our ministry strengthens our community, educates people of all ages, and helps people in need. By working together, our mission, "To Know Christ and Make Him Known" is carried out.
