"Embodiment of Faith"

Writing to new Christians, in what today is southern Turkey, the Apostle Paul summed up the central miracle and mystery which began with Jesus' birth: "In him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell."¹ For the duration of his earthly life, Jesus was God with us.² Through faith we can still experience him as such, but this relationship is difficult for those who have never encountered anyone sincerely seeking to embody Christ's teachings in daily life. It is our calling to help make the Christmas miracle real for them.

I have a magnetic cling which reads "Keep Christ in Christmas." I keep it on my refrigerator where it serves as a reminder to myself rather than an admonishment to others. If Christ is to remain in Christmas - or indeed become a part of Christmas for those who have not encountered him – then he must be born again and again in the hearts of his followers. The fullness of God may not dwell in us, but it must flow through us collectively as Christ's Church. I am reminded of the words of St. Theresa of Avila:

"Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks with compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body. Christ has no body now on earth but yours."

With the passing of years, I am ever more convinced that the essence of Christmas lies within each of us. It is not to be found in the exchange of gifts, the sounds of carols, or the hanging of lights and greens, but rather in the quiet birth of God's Spirit into each of our hearts. It is this which gives joy and peace, this embodiment of God's Word which births hope into the world.

O holy Child of Bethlehem Descend to us, we pray Cast out our sin and enter in Be born to us today We hear the Christmas angels The great glad tidings tell O come to us, abide with us Our Lord Emmanuel

A Note From Your Treasurer

As 2019 draws to a close, I am heartened by the faith expressed by the members of my church. We started 2019 with a looming budget deficit. In faith, members worked together, rolled up their sleeves, and did the work necessary to reduce costs and keep our church on solid ground financially. Mild weather also helped. As 2020 begins, a budget deficit will again be looming. Much of the cost reductions are already recognized in the 2020 budget, and so now we are moving forward in faith that members will respond with increased contributions of their time, talent and financial resources.

The "ministry funding plan" presented at Church Council on November 17 was intended to construct a different and perhaps more compelling view of the people (\$142,456), property (\$76,694), loans (\$44,934), denomination (\$44,946) and all else (\$19,166) expenses, as follows:

- Worship (\$100,911) Pastoral and music leadership, worship space, organ, piano, hand bells, sheet music, licenses, guest musicians and guest pastors.
- Christian Education (\$39,333) Pastoral leadership, classrooms, curriculum and supplies for Sunday school, adult study groups, inquirer's class, confirmation class, VBS, cradle roll and YAMS.
- **Pastoral Care (\$28,330)** Pastor's time invested, and office space used in member visitation and counseling.
- Christian Fellowship (\$15,307) Building use coordination, maintenance, cleaning and supplies for congregational fellowship and recreational activities, such as Women's Fellowship, Men's Fellowship, youth groups, Why Knots, Dart Team and volleyball.
- **Congregational Communications (\$18,876)** Office time and supplies to produce such devices as bulletin inserts, newsletters and weekly email blasts.
- **Community Connections (\$33,551)** Building use coordination, maintenance, cleaning and supplies for uses such as Putz, Preschool, Jesus Saves Ministry, Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts.
- Charitable Outreach (\$18,132) Financial, pastoral and building use support for local community ministries; such as, BAM Freezer Ministry, Moravian Open Door, Victory House, and Northeast Ministries.
- **Denominational Support (\$54,523)** Financial, pastoral and building use support for Provincial and District ministry and mission activities.
- Administrative (\$19,192) Materials, supplies and general administrative support.

Together, our ministry strengthens our community, educates people of all ages, and helps people in need. By working together, our mission, "**To Know Christ and Make Him Known**" is carried out.
