A Word from Pastor Linda Wisser

RESURRECTION – Sharing Good News!

It is interesting to look at the gospel stories immediately following the Resurrection. In those first accounts, Jesus was unrecognizable, even by his closest friends. Jesus was right there alongside of them, but they could not see him. In John's gospel, Mary thinks Jesus is the gardener (20.15). In Luke's gospel, the disciples think Jesus is a stranger on the road to Emmaus and they only recognize him in the breaking of bread (24.31). In Matthew's story, Jesus looks like lightening (28.3). From these stories, it is fair to say that when Jesus was raised from the dead, it was not simply an act of resuscitation, (where something is restored and returns to business as usual). What happens here is RESURRECTION...something former becomes made new. This is indeed Good News. Because just as God raised Jesus to new life, we too, along with all of creation, are being made new. We might not feel new, even when the Easter proclamation, "The Lord is Risen" is just freshly out of our mouths. For some, it is now a struggle to begin to come out of isolation and to rediscover how to be in the presence of others without fear. For others, news headlines leave us stunned and confused, not knowing what to do. We live with the reality of hardship and pain in this lifetime. Difficult news comes to us every day with power, and it can cause people to see the Good News of the Resurrection as an idle

tale....some long ago narrative that has lost its place among reality. We would settle for a breath of fresh air, an act of resuscitation to lift us up from the ways that life can bring us down. But God speaks so much more into our lives through faith in Jesus Christ, and through our relationship with others who believe.

Resurrection...new life, happens all around us. Look to see it in creation; in greening grass, bulbs beginning to bloom, and buds on trees. Resurrection...new life... Look to see it taking shape in the church as we begin to re-assemble in person and work towards strengthening relationships within the congregation and with our neighbors. Resurrection...new life....Look to see it in your own life. Do you recognize the presence of God in your midst summoning you to some kind of personal resurrection/new life? Where is it that you see the presence of God showing up? During this season of Easter we will explore how Jesus appeared and is appearing in our lives and in our world. Those appearances indeed change people, change situations, change our world, and make all things new. Join us in hearing and living into the Resurrection.



Group Spiritual Companioning

Spiritual Companioning groups are a way to create a safe, sacred space were a group of 3 to 5 people can share their life journey and listen for God's movement in their lives using spiritual listening—with their hearts. This is based on methods used by the early renewed Moravian Church in


the 1700's. One such group is already active at East Hills, and the church would like to start up 1-2 more groups of 3-5 people each, starting in late April or early May. They would be led by an experienced Spiritual Director, and would meet for 2 hours, monthly, for a commitment of 4-6 months.

You are invited to join an EHMC small group...

WHAT: What on Earth Am I Here For? A guided study of Rick Warren's book, <u>The Purpose Driven Life</u>. Please consider making a six-week commitment and joining facilitator Bill Matz in a journey with purpose comprised of a six-session online video-based study promoting discovery and insight into God's purpose for your life.


<u>Description</u>: Throughout the six sessions, you will discover the answer to life's most fundamental question: What on earth am I here for? According to Rick Warren, here's a clue to the answer: It's not about you! You were created by God and for God, and until you understand that, life will never make sense. It is only in God that we discover our origin, our identity, our meaning, our purpose, our significance and our destiny. Every other path leads to a dead end. The six sessions include: (1) You Matter to God, (2) You Were Planned for God's Pleasure, (3) You Were Formed for God's Family, (4) You Were Created to Become Like Christ, (5) You Were Shaped for Serving God, (6) You Were Made for a Mission.

WHO: This small group activity is available to ten EHMC members.

WHEN: This online study will be offered on six consecutive Monday evenings @7:00 PM; April 5, 12, 19, 26 and May 3 & 10. This forty-day commitment requires attendance to all sessions.

WHERE: The six sessions will take place using the online platform, Zoom. A Zoom link for joining the sessions will be emailed to participants prior to each session.

HOW: Your forty-day commitment of participation requires that you purchase <u>The Purpose Driven Life</u> (expanded edition, 2013) and study guide <u>What on Earth Am I Here For?</u> (2012) written by Rick Warren. A PDF version of the study guide will be made available upon request. An electronic device that is capable of audio and video access will be needed.







DONATION OPPORTUNITIES



Northeast Community Center: Last week we had the joy of assisting in the delivery of a large donation of food from our local Giant on Easton Avenue to the NECC Foodbank. It is wonderful to see a neighborhood business provide muchneeded assistance to the effort of feeding the hungry. We all miss the satisfaction of being able to provide A CAN A WEEK, but we can support this ministry through our prayers and financial contributions. Our EHMC group of foodbank volunteers looks forward to the day when we can safely return to our work on site, sorting, packing, and distributing food to the many people with food insecurity.



Drive-By Food Pantry - Help us restock our Food Pantry shelves at Central Moravian Church with much needed items for our next food distribution. Pull in front of our church office building at 73 West Church Street between 1 and 3 p.m. on Easter Sunday, (April 4). If people are coming to the sunrise service at God's Acre, they may leave their donations outside the Food Pantry door behind the Central Church office (accessed via driveway between 53 (Widows' House & 63 W. Church St). Otherwise, they can drop off from 1-3 PM as usual. Items needed are canned or dried beans, green beans, corn, boxed milk, canned soup, mac & cheese, peanut butter& jelly, ground coffee, tea, wrapped candy, soap & toilet paper.

On March 8th, EHMC received a thank you letter from Grace Young, Director of Marketing and Development at the NECC for the January donation of \$644.78. They are very grateful for the donation which was used to directly support the Food Pantry Program.

TREX Plastic Challenge Update – BAM Churches – 2020







<u>Trex plastics collections:</u> As of January, East Hills has met the goal of 500 pounds of recycled plastics and we are now eligible to receive a park bench for our campus! Collection accumulations will now accrue to West Side Moravian Church. When they have met their goal, the BAM churches participating in the Trex Plastic Challenge will have recycled plastics equivalent to the weight of a compact car!

To protect our continued eligibility for the program and the safety of the East Hills members who process the recycled materials, please observe the following criteria for acceptable goods: Look for the recycling symbols 2 or 4 printed on the packaging. Please limit other recycling to items on the following list. The plastics MUST NOT be contaminated with any foreign material or chemicals. The only exception is small paper labels.

*After volunteers bagged and weighed the plastics for our recent delivery to Weis Market, our community recycling partner, we found materials that DO NOT comply with the requirements for this program. Please recycle only acceptable materials!

ACCEPTABLE PLASTICS

Plastic shopping bags
Produce and bread bags
Grocery bags
Cereal box liners
Ice bags
Wood pellet bags
Salt bags
Ziplock and other re-closable bags
Case overwrap
Newspaper sleeves
Dry cleaning bags
Bubble wrap & air pillows
Pallet wrap and stretch film

NOT ACCEPTABLE PLASTICS

Plastic bottles or other rigid plastic containers

Degradable/compostable bags

Pre-washed salad mix bags

Frozen food bags

Candy wrappers

Any Chip bags

Dried fruit and nut bags

Six-pack plastic rings

Pouch packaging

Cheese wrappers

Zip lock bags

Saran Wrap

Bread wrappers with little air holes

Cellophane wrappers

Bird seed or other bulk bags that are not #4

If material does not stretch easily

If material is shiny & crinkles or crunches

^{**} All plastic must be clean, dry and free of food residue. **












