A Word from Pastor Linda Wisser

"More Fully Alive"

As we turn the page of the calendar to March, we look forward to the coming of Springtime with longer days, warmer sunshine (hopefully), and all of creation becoming

more fully alive after a long winter. In the Christian Church, we are in the season of Lent in March, a season with the intention for *us* to become more fully alive...alive in God!

Daily life is challenging at times. As part of a community of faith, we are continuously reminded that God's intention for us and for all is LIFE... full, meaningful, abundant life. An Update from the Joint Board Concerning Re-opening for Worship:

Dear Church Family,

Like many of you, we are cautiously hopeful as the COVID19 positivity rates and number of cases in Lehigh and Northampton

Counties continue to decline, and as the number of people gaining access to vaccines continues to grow. And like many of you, it is the desire of the East Hills MC Joint Board to open our building and return to in-person worship services. We share the disappointment of time physically apart from one another in the space that is meaningful for our expressions of faith. It has not been easy for the Board to wrestle with our need to be together and the need to be apart. We have appreciated the prayers and support of this congregation during this difficult year.

At our March 1st Joint Board meeting, we voted to continue to follow our original threshold numbers to determine when the building would be open. Those numbers are below 10% positivity rate and less than 100 cases of COVID per 100,000 people in Lehigh and Northampton Counties. They are numbers recommended by the PA Dept. of Health and used by area school districts. We adopted these numbers because they are indicators for risk of community spread.

As we look to returning to in-person worship services, the Joint Board will use a three-week rolling average of the numbers to determine when the building is open again. This is deliberate. Once we open, we desire to remain open. By adopting the rolling average of 3 weeks, we will avoid being open one week and closed the next due to any fluctuation in weekly numbers. We will also follow this rolling average process if numbers begin to increase again to avoid prematurely re-closing the building in the case of any future spike in cases.

We hope you can remain patient.

Concerning Easter Worship:

The Board also voted at the March 1st meeting, that *if the numbers allow for in-person worship on Easter Sunday,* we will hold the 6:30 a.m. Easter Sunrise worship service in the sanctuary and conclude the service outside. The 10:30 a.m. Easter service will be held in the Family Center in order to accommodate a larger attendance while practicing social distanced seating. Our hope, based on a trend of declining COVID19 numbers, would be to continue in-person worship services as well as offering online options. Please continue to watch our weekly Thursday emails for information about upcoming worship plans.

We want to acknowledge with thanks, the good work of the Re-opening Committee for their recommendations to the Joint Board. And we look forward, with hope, to the coming months ahead!

SPRING LEARNING AND GROWTH OPPORTUNITIES:

Group Spiritual Companioning

Spiritual Companioning groups are a way to create a safe, sacred space were a group of 3 to 5 people can share their life journey and listen for God's movement in their lives using spiritual listening—with their hearts. This is based on methods used by the early renewed Moravian Church in

the 1700's. One such group is already active at East Hills, and the church would like to start up 1-2 more groups of 3-5 people each, starting in late April or early May. They would be led by an experienced Spiritual Director, and would meet for 2 hours, monthly, for a commitment of 4-6 months.

More detailed information about how these groups work and benefit the participants can be found in the July 2018 edition of The Moravian magazine, and can be found just by typing 'Spiritual Companioning, The Moravian' in a search engine. You are invited to join an EHMC small group...

WHAT: What on Earth Am I Here For? A guided study of Rick Warren's book, <u>The Purpose Driven Life</u>. Please consider making a six-week commitment and joining facilitator Bill Matz in a journey with purpose comprised of a six-session online video-based study promoting discovery and insight into God's purpose for your life.


<u>Description</u>: Throughout the six sessions, you will discover the answer to life's most fundamental question: What on earth am I here for? According to Rick Warren, here's a clue to the answer: It's not about you! You were created by God and for God, and until you understand that, life will never make sense. It is only in God that we discover our origin, our identity, our meaning, our purpose, our significance and our destiny. Every other path leads to a dead end. The six sessions include: (1) You Matter to God, (2) You Were Planned for God's Pleasure, (3) You Were Formed for God's Family, (4) You Were Created to Become Like Christ, (5) You Were Shaped for Serving God, (6) You Were Made for a Mission.

WHO: This small group activity is available to ten EHMC members.

WHEN: This online study will be offered on six consecutive Monday evenings @7:00 PM; April 5, 12, 19, 26 and May 3 & 10. This forty-day commitment requires attendance to all sessions.

WHERE: The six sessions will take place using the online platform, Zoom. A Zoom link for joining the sessions will be emailed to participants prior to each session.

HOW: Your forty-day commitment of participation requires that you purchase <u>The Purpose Driven Life</u> (expanded edition, 2013) and study guide <u>What on Earth Am I Here For?</u> (2012) written by Rick Warren. A PDF version of the study guide will be made available upon request. An electronic device that is capable of audio and video access will be needed.

"Outreach" – getting to know the people in our neighborhood and finding ways to establish new relationships with the neighbors surrounding the church building.





BES Shelter Volunteering - FOOD SERVERS NEEDED FOR BETHLEHEM EMERGENCY SHELTER - We needs 3 people each month to serve the 6:30 seating at BES on 3/13, and 4/10. One person should be there at @ 5:30 the others at 6:00. No interaction with guests, prepare trays the same and push them through a partition. After the meal, pack food into quart containers and return them to the church, take some home or to someone in need. Sanitize table tops and chairs, take out trash. NO DISHWASHING as everything will be disposable. You must be 18 or older to volunteer. Gather a crew for one month, or multiple months.



Women's Fellowship: Will be meeting by Zoom on Tuesday, March 2, at 7 pm. We are studying the Book of Esther, and Tuesday's discussion will be centered on the 4th Chapter of Esther, when she is faced with making a decision to sacrifice her safety, and possibly even her life, for the sake of her people. All women are invited to join in our informal meetings.



Men's Fellowship: As we continue to open areas of the church and our lives, the Men's Fellowship Group wants to let you know we are still here. REASONS FOR BUILDING A COMMUNITY HALL/PRAYER HOUSE

There is no place/land or any building where the Moravians can meet and worship in the capital city Lilongwe despite the presence of many existing members from other districts where the Moravian is, and also many willing members to worship with the Moravian. The church in Lilongwe will be a model congregation and attract many Christians who are not reached with the gospel.

- The community hall proposed will be generating income through hiring for activities such as weddings, seminars and also kindergarten learning and the income will be used for church improvement and caring of the resident pastor
- The project will be on going considering that even the provincial head office will be favored to be located at this congregation.
- It will promote and strengthen networking and collaboration with other churches that are winning within the capital city such as the Lutheran Church, The Presbyterian Church (CCAP), The Baptist Convention of Malawi and many other churches.
- The project will also respond to Government demand for MoHDevS which is a strong partner in charitable work to also influence the opening of the church in Lilongwe as a need.

TREX Plastic Challenge Update – BAM Churches – 2020







<u>Trex plastics collections:</u> As of January, East Hills has met the goal of 500 pounds of recycled plastics and we are now eligible to receive a park bench for our campus! Collection accumulations will now accrue to West Side Moravian Church. When they have met their goal, the BAM churches participating in the Trex Plastic Challenge will have recycled plastics equivalent to the weight of a compact car!

To protect our continued eligibility for the program and the safety of the East Hills members who process the recycled materials, please observe the following criteria for acceptable goods: Look for the recycling symbols 2 or 4 printed on the packaging. Please limit other recycling to items on the following list. The plastics MUST NOT be contaminated with any foreign material or chemicals. The only exception is small paper labels.

*After volunteers bagged and weighed the plastics for our recent delivery to Weis Market, our community recycling partner, we found materials that DO NOT comply with the requirements for this program. Please recycle only acceptable materials!
