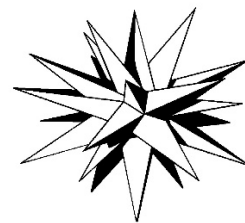

A Word from Pastor Linda Wisser



In a recent small group study offered at East Hills, the following thought from Rick Warren's book, "Purpose Driven Life" was shared. He writes that among other things, the church can be viewed as a laboratory where we are all learning how to love God and learning how to love one another. This thought landed solid in me, as I noticed this past month another learning that seems to be taking place. After more than a year of being physically apart from our church family, it seems we are now re-learning how to gather in person again. That may sound a bit strange, but for some, this transition BACK to physical presence with others is not coming easy. For those of us who were not 'essential' workers and on lock down for an extended period of time, it took a while to adapt to that lifestyle. So it is fair to expect that transitioning out into the world again will require some adjustment and patience.

I want to encourage us all to be gracious with one another, and to root ourselves in the words of our Lord who told his disciples to love one another (John 13:33-35). It's important that we continue to learn how to do this well, whether we are in person or gathered remotely, because our deep capacity to love one another will strengthen our capacity to love our neighbor.

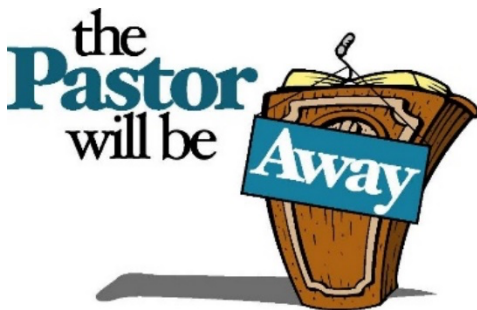

Group Spiritual Companionship

Spiritual Companionship groups are a way to create a safe, sacred space where a group of 3 to 5 people can share their life journey and listen for God's movement in their lives using spiritual listening—with their hearts. This is based on methods used by the early renewed Moravian Church in the 1700's. One such group is already active at East Hills, and the church would like to start up 1-2 more groups of 3-5 people each, starting in late April or early May. They would be led by an experienced Spiritual Director, and would meet for 2 hours, monthly, for a commitment of 4-6 months.

VBS - Save the Dates:

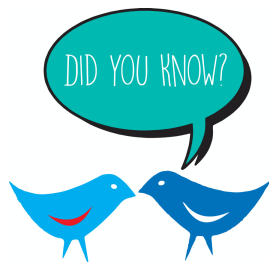

Worship and Mission Opportunities



Since we are back in the sanctuary for worship, please adhere to the EHMC Joint Board approved guidelines:

EHMC Indoor Church Service Safety Practices. Updated May 17, 2021

- Wear face masks correctly at all times
- Practice physical distancing: 3 to 6 feet apart
- Wash hands for 20 seconds and/or use hand sanitizer
- Please stay home if you are feeling ill.

WE WILL:

- Have extra masks available.
- Post signs about proper hand washing, wearing masks correctly, and physical distancing.
- Collect contact information: Take photos of attendees or create a list of attendees.
- To reduce high-touch contact, open entrance doors before and exit doors after the service.
- Air Circulation: Open back sanctuary windows (the 2 center windows and the west corner window). Use a fan in the outer door at the front of the sanctuary to blow air out. Open doors to narthex.
- Worship Presentation: Use AV Projection for program, liturgies, scriptures.
- Music: Use pre-taped music or guitars, keyboard, organ where feasible.
- Permit Responsive readings and singing while masked.
- Offertory: Use a collection box. Don't pass the plate.
- Not allow use of water fountains.



Small Group Gatherings are now allowed in the building.

EHMC Small Group Safety Practices - May 19, 2021

Wear face masks correctly at all times. Practice physical distancing: 3 to 6 feet apart. Wash hands for 20 seconds and/or use hand sanitizer

Group size is determined based on room size. Please stay home if you are feeling ill.

Other Considerations:

- To limit area cleaning, participants should only use the assigned meeting space. If weather permits, open windows for fresh air circulation. Please close windows when you are done and leave space as you found it.
- Please do not plan an event with shared refreshments.
- Keep a record of the meeting date, group name, leaders' names, and participant's names.
- If someone becomes sick or is COVID positive within the 14 days after the event, the group leader should contact the church office (610-868-6481). **Maintain confidentiality.** The group leader should notify all group members present of possible exposure to someone who is positive for COVID-19. Self-isolation is recommended along with monitoring for symptoms for 14 days.

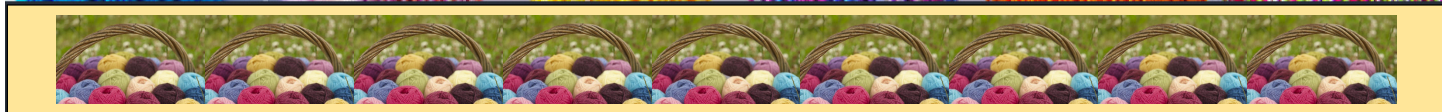

East Hills Moravian Church Contextual Outreach

UPDATES:



Dear Friends,

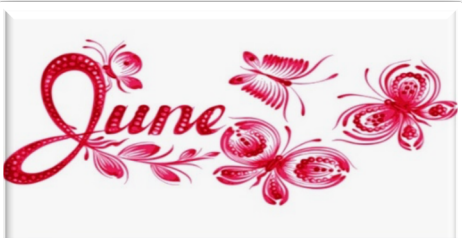
As you may know, Joint Board members and others at East Hills participated in a two-session series called, “Contextual Outreach”, led by Dr. Jill Peters, Missional Developer at Moravian Theological Seminary. The series is designed to help congregations gather information and use tools to get to know our neighbors, area needs, and potential ways to serve. This was what I call a ‘discovery’ process which is intended to help us to actively engage people in our neighborhood.

Step one is learning about people and needs in the area. Here are some of the things we discovered so far and potential opportunities for follow up:

- * Conversations with people who live near the church indicate that some are not aware that the church is here. The building is as a ‘fixture’ in the landscape. Opportunity to make simple visible changes to draw attention, opportunity for outside activity.
- * In conversation with Dr. Quinones at Gov. Wolfe Elementary School, we learned that parking for families and their small children at drop off and pick up time is limited and very difficult. The school has asked us to consider use of our lot for morning drop off time and afternoon pick up time on school days. Liability and possibility being looked at.
- * There is a need for classroom space for childcare and preschool programs offered by Head Start of the Lehigh Valley and LVCC. A meeting is planned with LVCC to learn more about what it could look like for use of EPMC preschool rooms by LVCC and how we might serve children and families who participate in that program.
- * We met with the BASD director of student services and were able to distribute, into all schools, information concerning the BAM Freezer Ministry. We are also expecting to receive information about the Summer Lunch Program of BASD and their need for host sites. We also learned of occasional need for storage of food.
- * Conversations with local middle school and elementary school staff members reflect needs for food, mental health support, health and dental care. Concern for a decrease in food security and an increase in mental health issues.
- * Spring Garden Elementary School could use volunteers for outside maintenance of flower beds.
- * Mission Insight reports provided us with statistical data relating to residents surrounding East Hills. This data was evaluated and summarized in reports called “Ministry Priorities”, Religious Priorities, and “Mosaics”. We will continue to review the details of these reports and discern our response to what we’ve learned.

Watch for monthly updates on Contextual Outreach. This is really just the beginning of our work in becoming acquainted with our neighbors and discovering ways to build relationships with people nearby. If you have questions or want to become involved in this exciting work of ministry, please talk to any Joint Board member or Pastor Linda.

A Can A Week and Joyful Noise - Since we are now holding in-person worship, we can restart CAN A WEEK! For the time being, please limit your donations to the following: shampoo, diapers, and baby wipes. Clients are not given the opportunity to choose specific food at this time, and we are streamlining the packing process by using canned goods from 2nd Harvest, which have been ample enough to meet the current need. We of course will continue to use **JOYFUL NOISE** donations to fill any gaps in food availability. Thanks for your ongoing support to these important ministries!



Drive-By Food Pantry at Central Moravian Church with much needed items for our next food distribution. Pull in front of our church office building at 73 West Church Street on **June 6th from 1 pm to 3 pm.** Items needed: chicken or beef soup/broth, fruit cocktail, pears, ketchup, baking mixes, salad dressing, sugar, flour. We are also needing anything that is low sodium. Look at the label and if it lists sodium at 10% DV or less, we are saying that is “low sodium.” We are asking that donations come in paper bags (doubled) or cardboard boxes. Those can be recycled or repurposed. We will accept donations in any form, but believe plastic is not the best for our environment.



MEDICAL EQUIPMENT LOANER CLOSET

East Hills is starting a Medical Equipment Loaner Closet to help those with short term and long-term needs for smaller items that are often not paid for by insurance. It is also the answer for those who would like to unload usable equipment from their basements that are left over from prior needs.

First, the ground rules:

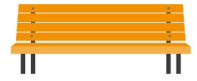
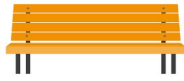
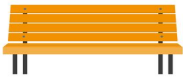
1. NO HOSPITAL BEDS OR REGULAR SIZED WHEELCHAIRS. All equipment must be clean and in safe, working condition.
2. Acceptable items include bath seats, raised toilet seats and commodes, portable bed rails, walkers, crutches, travel wheelchairs, reachers (grabbers), sock aides, long shoehorns.
3. Donors can reclaim their equipment at any time if they need it.
4. Items will be accessed only by closet coordinator(s) in order to keep track of inventory availability and condition.
5. Contact Karen if you wish to donate or have a need for equipment. Karen is a retired Occupational Therapist with vast home care experience, and will help you determine your needs, help set the equipment up properly, and ensure that you can use it safely.
6. Karen also is trained in home safety assessments for recommendations for modifications and is happy to help you with these needs as well.
7. East Hills is not liable for any injuries incurred while using the equipment.

Current inventory includes:

- a car swivel disc
- commode
- raised toilet seat
- portable bed rail
- shower seat
- tub transfer bench
- rollator walker (with seat)
- travel wheelchair
- long shoehorns
- sock aide
- compression sock aide

We are looking for a back-up coordinator in case Karen is not available. This person would be instructed in the use and set up of devices.

TREX Plastic Challenge Update – BAM Churches – 2020




Trex plastics collections: As of January, East Hills has met the goal of 500 pounds of recycled plastics and we are now eligible to receive a park bench for our campus! Collection accumulations will now accrue to West Side Moravian Church. When they have met their goal, the BAM churches participating in the Trex Plastic Challenge will have recycled plastics equivalent to the weight of a compact car!

To protect our continued eligibility for the program and the safety of the East Hills members who process the recycled materials, please observe the following criteria for acceptable goods: Look for the recycling symbols 2 or 4 printed on the packaging. Please limit other recycling to items on the following list. The plastics **MUST NOT** be contaminated with any foreign material or chemicals. The only exception is small paper labels.


After volunteers bagged and weighed the plastics for our recent delivery to Weis Market, our community recycling partner, we found materials that DO NOT comply with the requirements for this program. **Please recycle only acceptable materials!*

- Produce and bread bags

- Bubble wrap & air pillows
- Pallet wrap and stretch film

NOT ACCEPTABLE PLASTICS



- Plastic bottles or other rigid plastic containers
- Degradable/compostable bags
- Pre-washed salad mix bags
- Frozen food bags
- Candy wrappers
- Any Chip bags
- Dried fruit and nut bags
- Six-pack plastic rings
- Pouch packaging
- Cheese wrappers
- Zip lock bags
- Saran Wrap
- Bread wrappers with little air holes
- Cellophane wrappers
- Bird seed or other bulk bags that are not #4
- If material does not stretch easily

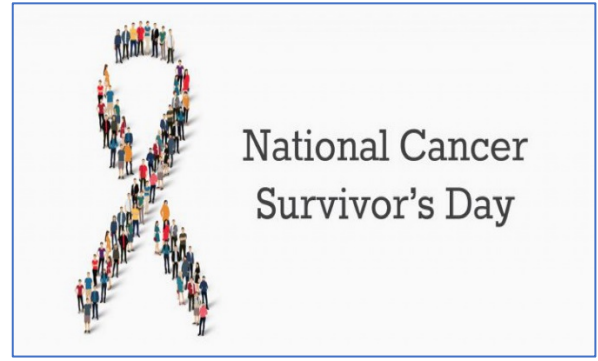
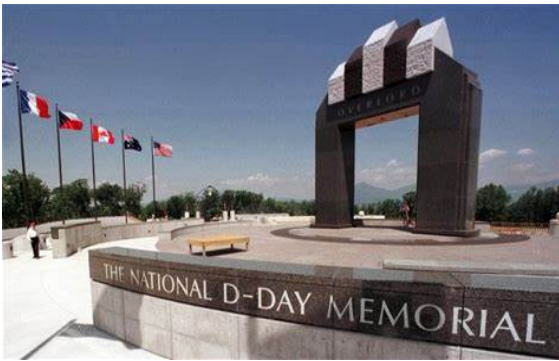

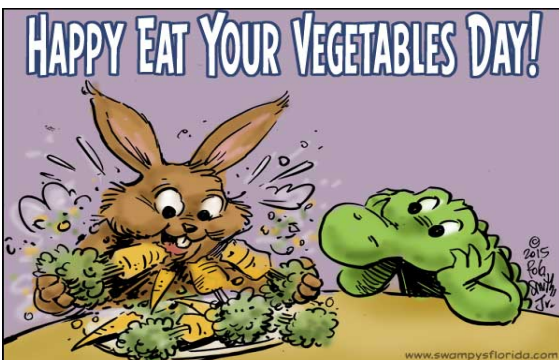
