

A Word from Pastor Línda Wísser

Eastern District Synod News and Reflection

On June 24th and 25th, delegates from across the

Moravian Church Eastern District met on Zoom in the gathering for the 2021 Eastern District Synod. The theme for Synod was "Into the Word...this is the challenge of our mission." I had the great joy of representing our congregation together with our elected delegates: Jon Burcaw, Laura Kemmerer and Jay Larson.

The primary purpose of District Synods, according to the Moravian Church Book of Order, is to bring people together for spiritual renewal and fellowship. This was accomplished well, even though the gathering was completely online. Our worship and teaching was based on Paul's letter to the Philippians, and we reflected on Paul's words to the early church...he was in prison, and the church had great concern for him. But Paul pointed out that his imprisonment was actually helping to spread the gospel. As a prisoner of the imperial guard, Paul now had access to people in high places and word was spreading about this prisoner and his teachings. Paul encouraged the Philippians to rejoice in all circumstances because God was at work, and the gospel was being shared. This was a wonderful encouragement for the churches represented at Synod. Our circumstances this past year have seemed less than something to rejoice in. Rev. Lynnette Delbridge invited delegates to consider how the gospel was spread through our ministries this past year despite the circumstances we were in. Central Moravian Church adapted their food bank collection to a drive-by drop off and now they receive triple the amount of food and not only from church members but from neighbors and community groups as well. And the gospel is shared! Many churches, like East Hills, have learned to host online worship and have seen a marked increase in the number of people attending...some worshippers who we will never meet in person have sent emails to let us know they are touched. And the gospel is being shared! Other churches were able to serve through food ministries, mask making, offering space for vaccination sites. And the gospel is being shared!

I want to encourage all of us to take a good look at our website, this newsletter, the Thursday emails, and take notice at all the opportunities we have to bring Christ's love "into the world" where Christ Jesus sends us. The gospel is being shared!

Take a look at Moravian.org website and see the many churches and organizations that make up the Moravian Church and the ministry that is happening worldwide. East Hills is an important part of the larger church. The gospel is being shared!

For this reason, as Paul, our ancestor in faith once put it, "I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy ...because of your sharing in the gospel."

More Eastern District News:

The Synod elected The Rev. Melissa Johnson to serve as Eastern District President for the next inter-synodal period. We pray for our siblings in Christ at Advent Moravian Church and for Melissa during this time of transition.

We had a chance to say "thank you' and bless Rev. David Bennett for his years of service as District President. We pray for David as he transitions to his next ministry.

The Synod was presented with a District Budget that was affirmed. The Finance Committee was challenged to fund district ministries with the current level of resources available. "Painful" decisions were made to decrease funding to important ministries such as Hope Conference and Renewal Center as well as funding for the District staff positions of Director of Christian Education and Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries. The incoming District Executive Board is now charged with determining how these staff positions will be structured to support the needs of our congregations within the budget constraints.

The keynote address was given by author, speaker, musician, David Lamotte who talked about change and how we are shaped by certain narratives. One illustration he offered is that on a trip from North Carolina to California...one turn can land you in Mexico instead... making one decision can impact our direction and where we end up. He also talked about how our worldview is rooted in narrative. Our culture sells the 'hero' narrative but in the church, a 'movement' narrative has greater and sustaining impact.

East Hills Moravian Church Contextual Outreach UPDATE:

Each month in this section of the newsletter we will be providing you with important news about community connections and outreach opportunities we are discovering as we seek to connect to our neighborhood.

On June 16th the Joint Board and other members at large met with Charles Dinifrio, President and CEO of Lehigh Valley Childcare



Centers, and Jessica Nasatka, Vice President of Early Education and Childcare. We met to learn about LVCC and the programs they provide to local families. These programs include childcare, preschool, after school care and other services. We are exploring the potential for East Hills to establish a relationship with Lehigh Valley Childcare Services which would allow for these programs to be held in our building. This could allow us to become one of their community partners and support the good work they are doing, and for East Hills to serve neighborhood families and support healthy learning environment for local children.

We are still in the exploration stage of this conversation, and no decisions have been made. At our next Contextual Outreach meeting we will discuss how this relationship would help us fulfill our mission, 'to know Christ and to make Him known", how might it help us build relationships with neighbors, what risks are involved and are we willing to take them, what potential blessings are there and are we willing to give them and receive them?


The following is a synopsis of the book from Penguin Random House...

Hope in Times of Fear is a book that unlocks the meaning of Jesus's resurrection for readers. Easter is considered the most solemn and important holiday for Christians. It is a time of spiritual rebirth and a time of celebrating the physical rebirth of Jesus after three days in the tomb. For his devoted followers, nothing could prepare them for the moment they met the resurrected Jesus. Each failed to recognize him. All of them physically saw him and yet did not spiritually truly see him. It was only when Jesus reached out and invited them to see who he truly was that their eyes were open. Here the central message of the Christian faith is revealed in a way only Timothy Keller could do it–filled with unshakable belief, piercing insight, and a profound new way to look at a story you think you know. After reading this book, the true meaning of Easter will no longer be unseen.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Timothy Keller was born and raised in Pennsylvania, and educated at Bucknell University, Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, and Westminster Theological Seminary. He was first a pastor in Hopewell, Virginia. In 1989 he started Redeemer Presbyterian Church in New York City, with his wife, Kathy, and their three sons. Today, Redeemer has more than five thousand regular Sunday attendees and has helped to start over 250 new churches around the world. Also the author of *Every Good Endeavor, The Meaning of Marriage, Generous Justice, Counterfeit Gods, The Prodigal God, Jesus the King*, and *The Reason for God*, Timothy Keller lives in New York City with his family.

On June 6th we celebrated the 64th anniversary of the East Hills Moravian Church. Pastor Linda invited previous EHMC pastors to write a letter or memory to share with the congregation. Please enjoy these memories:

In 1957, the 500th year anniversary of the founding of the Moravain Church in Bohemia and Moravia, The Moravian Church, Northern Province, set out to establish a congregation in the East Hills section of Bethlehem, PA.

With little budget and a somewhat fuzzy vision. The District Board funded the purchase of a house on Butztown Road, chartered the congregation and called the first Pastor, The Rev. Larry Lindemmuth. Many were unsure there was enough strength to begin such a work and at least one church leader said, "if the congregation doesn't make it we can always sell the house."

Well, obviously those who were lukewarm or timid about the need for East Hills, didn't know the Holy Spirit had other plans. A strong group of deeply faithful Charter Members stepped up and powered the first years of East Hill's dynamic life. While Pastors have come and gone the outstanding Christian service among lay members of the congregation has always been its strength. In waves they have come, and in each new era other faithful, energetic leaders have carried forward the mission.

One of the things that most characterizes the mission at East Hills is the continued emphasis on reaching out in mission today, not a reliance on past achievements. Serving those who others might not think deserve service, reaching out in love and service to those in pain or need, humbly loving and caring for all people, have been key characteristics for the mission of East Hills. My family and I have been blessed by being part of the East Hills mission and are deeply grateful for your love and care. I have every conviction that the one who began a mission with you in 1957 will bring it to ever fuller richness and fruitfulness.

During my years at East Hills, the narthex was enlarged to accommodate the fellowship needs of the congregation. A few years later, another building project expanded the church offices behind the church, which also included additional Sunday school classroom space.

Above all else, I remember the warmth of the fellowship and the relationships I was privileged to share.

In the 27 years since our time together, the world which God calls us to serve becomes increasingly complex, unsettling, uncertain, and divided.


Though I saw many instances of Christian hospitality during my time at East Hills, two stand out in my mind. The first was the congregation's decision to host the Bethlehem Emergency Women's shelter which I experienced as a wonderful response to Jesus' words in the 25th chapter of Matthew's Gospel: " …for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me …" The second was when the congregation welcomed the good folks from Jesus Saves ministry into our church home. In both cases the church, as a community of faith, stepped out from its' comfort zone a bit. It looked at situations from the perspective of "How do we honor God's call," rather than "How does this benefit us?"

Such decisions are a faithful expression of the Apostle Paul's words to Christians in Rome two millennia ago. By "the mercies of God ... present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind ..." It is when we share ourselves and the resources God has entrusted to us as a living sacrifice for the well-being of others that those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ may best be able to see him reflected in ourselves - both individually, and as a community of Christian faith.



Drive-By Food Pantry at Central Moravian Church with much needed items for our next food distribution. Pull in front of our church office building at 73 West Church Street on July 11th and August 1st from 1 pm to 3 pm. Items needed remain the same: chicken or beef soup/broth, fruit cocktail, pears, ketchup, baking mixes, salad dressing, sugar, flour. We are also needing anything that is low sodium. Look at the label and if it lists sodium at 10% DV or less, we are saying that is "low sodium."

We are asking that donations come in paper bags (doubled) or cardboard boxes. Those can be recycled or repurposed. We will accept donations in any form, but believe plastic is not the best for our environment.





East Hills is starting a Medical Equipment Loaner Closet to help those with short term and long-term needs for smaller items that are often not paid for by insurance. It is also the answer for those who would like to unload usable equipment from their basements that are left over from prior needs.

First, the ground rules:

- 1. NO HOSPITAL BEDS OR REGULAR SIZED WHEELCHAIRS. All equipment must be clean and in safe, working condition.
- 2. Acceptable items include bath seats, raised toilet seats and commodes, portable bed rails, walkers, crutches, travel wheelchairs, reachers (grabbers), sock aides, long shoehorns.
- 3. Donors can reclaim their equipment at any time if they need it.
- 4. Items will be accessed only by closet coordinator(s) in order to keep track of inventory availability and condition.
- 5. Contact the church office if you wish to donate or have a need for equipment. We have a retired Occupational Therapist with vast home care experience, and will help you determine your needs, help set the equipment up properly, and ensure that you can use it safely.
- 6. She is also trained in home safety assessments for recommendations for modifications and is happy to help you with these needs as well.
- 7. East Hills is not liable for any injuries incurred while using the equipment.

- shower seat
- tub transfer bench
- rollator walker (with seat)
- travel wheelchair
- long shoehorns
- sock aide
- compression sock aide

Your recyclables can be dropped off during normal Church Office hours and Sundays, before and after worship.

<u>Please include only acceptable materials!</u> To protect our continued eligibility for the program and the safety of the East Hills members who process the recycled materials, please observe the following criteria for acceptable goods. Look for the recycling symbols 2 or 4 printed on the packaging. Please limit other recycling to items on the list of acceptable materials. The plastics MUST NOT be contaminated with any foreign material or chemicals. The only exception is small paper labels. We recently received Fresh Step packaging that was clearly marked that it is NOT acceptable for this program. Please inspect ALL packaging for the acceptable recycling symbols 2 or 4. Any materials that do not have these symbols or are not in compliance with the list of acceptable materials must be separated and discarded by our volunteers. Your considerate recycling is most appreciated.
