# Easter 2022... Searching for Signs of Life

With Easter quickly approaching and the current threat of COVID19 behind us for now, it is great to see plans for Easter Egg Hunts this year and to anticipate children gathering again this year. I have happy memories of the years when our kids were little and the fun we had at egg hunts, seeking and finding those little treasures that were sometimes easily seen and other times, hard to find.

As we turn our thoughts to the celebration of Easter Day, I am reminded that we grown-ups, are also invited to search for signs of life. Only our joy is not necessarily in plastic eggs, but seeking and finding God alive and at work in our midst, and knowing even if we can't see it, in Christ we indeed have life.

I've been on my own 'hunt' lately here at East Hills and I'm seeing all kinds of life around here; God alive and at work in our midst. This life of God can be seen in the people who are so compassionately caring for loved ones who are ill. # HOLY WEEK SERVICES – April 10-17 in person and on ZOOM!








# **EGG HUNT at East Hill Moravian Church**

# Moravian Disaster Response to the Ukrainian Crisis

The Board of World Mission invites your compassion and prayers for the people of Ukraine who are suffering because of the Russian invasion. The Czech Republic is among the countries receiving Ukrainian refugees, where our Moravian friends in the Czech Province are already providing hospitality. The Board of World Mission is humbled to be able to help collect funds to assist with Ukrainian refugee resettlement in Europe.

The Moravian congregation in Nová Paka is a wonderful example of the type of work happening throughout the Czech Province to support Ukrainian refugees. This congregation has owned a historic hotel since 2015, which is now functioning as living space for the first families that arrived from Kyiv last week. 

A CAN A WEEK: Please add PANCAKE MIX and COOKIES to your shopping list. They are the most-needed items at the NECC foodbank at this time. There is always a need for dish liquid, and grocery bags (paper and plastic), and especially TOOTHPASTE. Diapers (sizes 3 and 4) are also needed again since the ones donated last week have been distributed to needy families. JOYFUL NOISE funds can be donated at any time. Last week we used some of those funds to purchase much-needed chicken. Thank you for your support of these important ministries.



**Northeast Community Center:** "Because He First Fed Us" we respond with joy to feed others. In her book, Anita Hinkledey McVey writes that before God created us, "God created a garden. God was preparing a meal for us before we arrived." Jesus demonstrates concern for the food needs of others in feeding the 5,000, and he reminds us that when we feed the least of these, we are feeding Him.

Now is a good time to establish the habit of feeding others by joining our effort to provide A CAN A WEEK. It's simple to do. Put NECC on your shopping list and purchase just one can every time you shop. There are receptacle baskets in the Narthex which are emptied weekly, and your donations are taken to the foodbank for distribution just a few days later. To help fill the gaps in the most needed foods, watch our weekly announcement in the Thursday email blast or the updates on our EHMC Facebook page. At this time, the most-needed item is cold cereal, but there is always a need for toothpaste, dish liquid, and grocery bags (paper, plastic, and reusable).

<u>Drive-By Food Pantry at Central Moravian Church</u> with much needed items for our next food distribution. The drive by is located in Central Moravian Christian Ed parking lot, access road between Kemmerer Museum & God's Acre (follow signs). Sunday, April 3rd, 9:30 am -1:00 pm (rain/snow date, April 10th). Items needed: boxed (shelf stable) or powdered milk, cereal, flour, sugar, tomato paste, canned tomatoes, spaghetti sauce, ground coffee, jelly, toilet paper, infant and adult diapers, soap bars, no beans, or rice or at this time. Wrapped Easter candy or regular candy are welcome, as well as other items you might think would be good for a household in need.

We are asking that donations come in paper bags (doubled) or cardboard boxes. Those can be recycled or repurposed. We will accept donations in any form, but believe plastic is not the best for our environment.
