


Sunday, May 1st our worship service is a "Litany of Praise" service which will include lots of special music as the season of Easter Joy continues and we worship our Risen Lord!



Moravian Disaster Response to the Ukrainian Crisis

The Moravian Board of World Mission in North America (BWM) continues to be in conversation with our Moravian partners in Europe to see how we can best help those who are giving refuge to families fleeing the war in Ukraine. Please continue to pray for them. To date, we have received close to \$130,000, and we thank you for this critical support. Using these donations, funding has been sent to the Czech Province of the

Moravian Church where a number of congregations are hosting refugees. Among them is the Moravian congregation in Nová Paka, which is renovating space in a hotel they own to house up to 15 families. They are also hosting a Ukrainian primary school, allowing them to set up classes for the children. Moravian congregations in Germany are also sheltering refugees, and we have sent monetary support to the Moravian European Continental Province to assist congregations in places like Herrnhut, Königsfeld, Ebersdorf, and Cottbus. The money that we collect will help all these congregations provide food, shelter, personal hygiene products, household essentials, school supplies, and transportation for the families. These are tangible ways that the love of Christ is being shared. In addition, refugees are being offered places to worship and a welcoming Christian community.

A lawyer is currently working with the Café's Planning Team on zoning issues and the Moravian Ministries Foundation of America has generously provided a \$50,000 Hunger and Thirst Field of Interest Grant to help get the project started.

Thank you for your ongoing support of these important ministries which help provide food and other essentials for people in the Marvine-Pembroke area of our community.

Us" we respond with joy to feed others. In her book, Anita Hinkledey McVey writes that before God created us, "God created a garden. God was preparing a meal for us before we arrived." Jesus demonstrates concern for the food needs of others in feeding the 5,000, and he reminds us that when we feed the least of these, we are feeding Him.

Now is a good time to establish the habit of feeding others by joining our

effort to provide A CAN A WEEK. It's simple to do. Put NECC on your shopping list and purchase just one can every time you shop. There are receptacle baskets in the Narthex which are emptied weekly, and your donations are taken to the foodbank for distribution just a few days later. To help fill the gaps in the most needed foods, watch our weekly announcement in the Thursday email blast or the updates on our EHMC Facebook page. At this time, the most-needed item is cold cereal, but there is always a need for toothpaste, dish liquid, and grocery bags (paper, plastic, and reusable).

Drive-By Food Pantry at Central Moravian Church with much needed items for our next food distribution. The drive by is located in Central Moravian Christian Ed parking lot, access road between Kemmerer Museum & God's Acre (follow signs). Sunday, May 1, 2022, from 9:30 a.m. - 1 p.m. Items needed: boxed (shelf stable) milk, or powdered milk, flour, sugar, tomato paste, canned tomatoes, spaghetti sauce, ground coffee, jelly, ketchup, mustard, cake mixes, spices, toilet paper, infant and adult diapers, soap bars, (no beans or rice at this time). Any other items you might think to be good for a household in need.

We are asking that donations come in paper bags (doubled) or cardboard boxes. Those can be recycled or repurposed. We will accept donations in any form, but believe plastic is not the best for our environment.

Our second bench has arrived. The benches are in the area outside the Family Center and in the East hallway in the same area. Enjoy the rewards of having recycled 500 pounds of #2 and #4 plastics.

Join us for plastics weighing on 5/8 and 5/22 immediately following worship. Takes about 15 minutes to "bag and tag" the accumulated plastics in preparation for drop-off to the consolidation site.

Plastic bottles or other rigid plastic containers Degradable/compostable bags Pre-washed salad mix bags Frozen food bags **Candy wrappers** Any Chip bags Dried fruit and nut bags Six-pack plastic rings Pouch packaging **Cheese wrappers** Grocery store zip-lock bags (produce and deli) Plastic film food wrap, i.e. Saran Wrap Bread wrappers with little air holes **Cellophane wrappers** Bird seed or other bulk bags that are not #4 If material does not stretch easily or is shiny & crinkles or crunches.

** All plastic must be clean, dry and free of food residue.**


