

As you may know, each year the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce sponsors several Christmas Huts on Main Street. For the second year, the Chamber has graciously offered one of the Huts to Bethlehem Emergency Sheltering and Bethlehem Area Moravians Freezer

We will be offering free coffee and hot chocolate along with fresh-made cookies to the visitors on Main Street, as well as providing them with information about our organizations. In addition, the Chamber has appreciated

as well as providing them with information about our organizations. In addition, the Chamber has appreciated our effort to enlist the help of local musical organizations and groups to provide live seasonal music. It is such a plus to draw people to our Hut and help our causes. It is a joy to everyone who helps at the hut. Those that helped last year served over 1,000 individuals with hospitality, a hot beverage and information about our ministries. This year we expect the number to over double that, due to what we learned and expanded hours. Note the fresh-made cookies are new for this year.

The big ask – we need help at the huts for setup, serving and information sharing. Each shift requires 2 shift volunteers each from BES and the BAM Freezer Ministry, a set-up person and a coordinator (Bob Wingrove). Note – a set-up person can also stay and be a shift volunteer. Your time at the Huts will help keep our community aware of the ever-present needs of our homeless and our hungry neighbors. The following chart shows the dates and time of 16 events.


#### H.O.P.E. for the Neighborhood

As you may know, the EHMC congregation has lost several young adults in the past few years due to drug overdose or addictions related incidents. Other families in our congregation and surrounding neighborhood are currently navigating life with family members or extended family members struggling with addictions.

EHMC is partnering with The Center for Humanistic Change over the next several months to offer opportunities to gather and learn together. Our hope is to create an atmosphere where addictions awareness happens, where conversations can take place, and where resources are made known for anyone seeking them.

H.O.P.E. is Heroin and Opioid Prevention Education, a presentation being offered at East Hills Moravian Church on November 10th from 7-8:15 p.m., by our friends at the Center for Humanistic Change. It is for anyone who wants to learn a little more about the science of addictions and gain more understanding of this crisis many families are living with. Administration of NARCAN is part of the presentation, and all participants will receive a free NARCAN kit.








#### Moravian Open Door No Room at the Inn Offering.

An Advent Season Gift for Moravian Open Door Each Advent season we are reminded of the family long ago who was homeless, had no room at the inn, and not even a crib for their expected infant. Yet they were provided for. Moravian Open Door (MOD) is a Moravian ministry in New York City that provides a safe, clean, temporary home for up to 40 homeless men and women aged 50 years and older. While the facility (called Moravian House) provides accommodation in single and

double rooms, the staff provides supportive services to rebuild lives and help residents move to affordable permanent housing. During the pandemic of COVID-19, MOD mourned the loss of some of its residents to the virus, and some other residents and even the staff were sickened by the disease and recovered. Keeping everyone safe with extra sanitizing of building areas, providing residents precautionary items such as masks and hand sanitizer, and providing extra food for residents who have lost income has put a great strain on MOD's budget. MOD receives no government funding at all. MOD needs the financial support of Moravian congregations to continue its important service to the homeless. Join us for plastics weighing in the East Classroom on November 13<sup>th</sup> and 27th, immediately following worship. It takes about 15 minutes to "bag and tag" the accumulated plastics in preparation for drop-off to the consolidation site.




