# A Word from Pastor Linda Wisser

# "For the Healing of the World"....

That was the theme of the 2023 Moravian Church Northern Province (MCNP) Synod, which was held June 22-25<sup>th</sup>, 2023 at Moravian University in Bethlehem, PA. Clergy and lay delegates from across the province gathered to conduct the business of the church. Thank you to Carol Grace Hicks and Jon Ortwein, who served with me as delegates on behalf of our congregation.

The Provincial Elders Conference (PEC) is the elected governing body of the MCNP, called to carry out the legislation of synod. The Rev. Dr. Betsy Miller concluded her service as PEC president and the Rev. David Bennett was elected to serve as PEC president during the next inter-synod timeframe.

The synod body also elected two bishops to serve the Unity. In the Moravian Church, the office of 'bishop' is not one in a hierarchy of leadership, but rather, Moravian bishops serve as spiritual guides of the church and primarily as pastor to the pastors. Bishops serve the entire Unity...all provinces of the Moravian Church Worldwide, and once elected by synod, they serve as bishop for life. There is no term limit or salary for our bishops. The 2023 MCNP synod elected The Rev. Michael Johnson and The Rev. Amy Gohdes-Luhman as bishops of the unity.

The synod received a variety of reports from agencies and ministries of the MCNP. The Board of World Mission (BWM) issued a challenge to the MCNP related to the successful ministry of Trinity Moravian Church in Winston Salem and Medical Debt forgiveness. Trinity raised \$15,000 which was used to bid on, purchase, and FORGIVE over 3 million dollars of medical debt for people living in three counties near their church. The challenge issued to the MCNP was affirmed by MCNP synod for the Debt Jubilee Project, to raise \$50,000 between June 25<sup>th</sup> and August 13<sup>th</sup> 2023 for the purpose of the medical debt forgiveness program. There were 13 working groups (committees) at synod including Clergy Care, Spiritual Formation, Church and Society, Congregational Leadership, Governance, Ecumenical Relationships, Healthy Congregations, Mission in Our World, Mission Engagement in Our Neighborhoods, Emerging Ministries, Lay Leadership, Finance, and Stewardship. Every delegate worked as part of one of these committees. We affirmed ministry that has occurred since the last synod gathering. Committees also presented proposals and resolutions for directing the ministry of the MCNP in the next intersynodal timeframe. The Resolutions that have been approved will become available on the MCNP website. The East Hills MC Joint Board will take time to review the resolutions and discern ways to prioritize and implement the resolutions of the larger church in our unique context.

East Hills Moravian Church is part of a denomination that reaches across the globe. It was heartening to gather as part of the Northern Province and to hear the call to our congregations to serve in Jesus' name, "for the healing of the world".



The Debt Jubilee Project: For the Healing of the World is a collaborative effort of the Board of World Mission, the Commission on Congregational Development, the Moravian Ministries Foundation in America, and the Interprovincial Board of Communication. Based on our biblical call to care for the sick and our belief that healthcare is a fundamental human right, this project will work to offer grace and hope through the forgiveness of medical debt. Because our call is to our siblings in Christ here in North America and throughout the world, this project will forgive medical debt in the United States as well as at the Moravian medical ministry of the Clínica Evangélica Morava in Ahuas, Honduras.

Through this effort, we hope to build on the energy and witness of the <u>recent work</u> of Moravian congregations such as Trinity in Winston-Salem, which raised about \$15,000 earlier this year to forgive over \$3,000,000 in medical debt. The Debt Jubilee Project; For the Healing of the World aims to provide an opportunity for more Moravians to join in this freeing and life-changing initiative. *Our goal is to raise* \$50,000 in 50 days with the project concluding on August 13th.

75% of your gift will support the elimination of medical debt in the U.S. through a partnership with RIP Medical Debt, an organization that purchases medical debt for pennies on the dollar and erases that debt, which would otherwise have been sold to for-profit debt collectors. RIP Medical Debt only abolishes debt for those earning less than 4x the federal poverty level and/or hold debts of 5% or more of their annual income. The Debt Jubilee Project: For the Healing of the World will specifically forgive debts for those living in U.S. counties with a Moravian presence (through a congregation or ministry). The individuals and families who owe the medical debt purchased will receive a letter informing them that their debt is forgiven. Jubilee!


25% of your gift will buy debt owed by patients of the Clínica Evangélica Morava, a Moravian medical ministry in Ahuas, Honduras, that has been serving the remote area of La Mosquitia for over 75 years. Medical debt held in this area is a burden on the indebted patients, the clinic, and the community as a whole. The individuals and families who owe the medical debt purchased will receive notice informing them that their debt is forgiven. Jubilee!

# "Hear Us Out"...a learning opportunity coming this summer!

Earlier this year our Board members at East Hills participated in our annual Board retreat. Our keynote speaker was The Rev. Dr. Sue

Pizor Yoder, who is part of a writing team for the soon-to- be released book called, "Hear Us Out... 6 Questions on Belonging and Belief". The content of this book is centered on the findings of 5 years of research and interviews with "nones" (those who indicate no religious faith/preference) and "dones" (those 'done' with organized religion) from emerging generations (18-39 year olds).

The intention of the book is for congregations to gain an understanding of ways that young adults make meaning, find purpose, connect with others and God, and where they find hope. The book offers congregations a glimpse at a generation or two of young people who are deeply faithful, thoughtful, generous, and caring.... but who do not find that their faith fits into the traditional church setting.

#### The Frazetta Art Museum is home to the largest collection of Frazetta originals in the world.

Frank Frazetta, The God Father of Fantasy Art, Feb. 1928 - May 2010, born in Brooklyn, NY, discovered the wonders of drawing at a very young age. Throughout his lifetime, he had created some of the most iconic pieces of fantasy art, and continues to inspire people even today. Do any of these names strike a bell – Lord of the Rings, Conan the Barbarian, Silver Warrior, Buck Rogers, Ringo Starr cover of Mad Magazine, Fire and Ice Movie.

Reopened solely by Frank Frazetta Jr in 2013, the museum houses roughly 37 original oil pieces and countless pencil, pen and ink, and watercolor works; also housed are personal items such as part of his camera collection, sports equipment, easel, pallet, and much more! The museum resides on the original 67 acre estate in the heart of the Pocono mountains. This estate is where Frank created his most iconic paintings since 1971. His four children were brought up on this large parcel of land in a time when the Poconos were still in their "honeymoon" stage- with a population under 25,000 in the early 1970's to today totaling well over 250,000 residents. But the estate property has stayed intact since the original purchase in 1971, only to be groomed and landscaped to make it as beautiful as one could imagine.





**DON'T TOSS THOSE EMPTY PILL CONTAINERS!** Want to keep your empty pill bottles from ending up in the landfill for hundreds of years?

Matthew 25: ministries, an international humanitarian aid and disaster relief organization will include those bottles in shipments of medical supplies to areas where pills are often distributed in folded paper, which cannot protect medications from the weather or from the hands of children.

A marked tote container will be available near the Can-a-Week totes for collection. IT IS IMPERATIVE that you follow these guidelines:

- Bottles included in shipments of medical supplies must have an all plastic lid.
- Bottles should be sorted by color and type.
- All labels should be removed, leaving no glue or residue.
- All bottles and lids should be washed in very hot water and dish soap, rinsed, and dried thoroughly.
- Caps should be placed back onto clean, dried bottles.
- Clean, recapped bottles should be placed into large resealable bags marked "Clean Bottles." These will be included in shipments of medical supplies.
