A Word from Pastor Linda Wisser:

Advent is here... a holy season that differs from any other time of year. Here at the church, there are all kinds of signs that show us that this is a holy season. The putz is constructed and ready to be experienced, the greens are hung, Lovefeast is shared, Shepherd's Journey plans are in the works. These kinds of things signal that something special is happening. This is no longer "ordinary time" in the church.

So let me ask you, does it seem like a 'special' time...does it feel like an EXTRAordinary time? Or have we become de-sensitized or anesthetized not only to the season, but to what God has done, is doing, and will do?

I am particularly drawn to the readings from the book of Isaiah this season... readings that give voice to God's people then, who cried out saying 'this is not the world we hoped for!". These readings give us the voices of people at the end of their patience, people wondering when God will act, and people even at times accusing God, not only of failing to fix the mess, but of causing the mess in the first place. If you, like many, are looking at the world, our nation, or events in your personal life and are thinking 'this is not the world we hoped for", or maybe, "this is not the life we hoped for", then I want to encourage you this season, to enter the season of Advent with us, or perhaps more appropriately, allow Advent to enter you. Because something special is indeed happening. God is doing something EXTRAordinary and the season of Advent would have us awaken and prepare to experience it!

The pages ahead are filled with news about ways for us to journey together into this holy season, to encourage one another and be strengthened in faith. Come and hear the stories of how God appears in the most unexpected, unpredictable ways for the sake of the world God loves. If God appeared then, to ordinary people and in ordinary places, who knows where God will appear next...maybe even to you and me?!

Join us on Sundays this season to be renewed, refreshed, restored in the sure and certain promises of God! We hope to see you very soon.



JOYS AND CELEBRATIONS:

<u>DEBT JUBILEE PROJECT SUCCESS:</u> This summer, generous Moravians came together to offer grace and hope through the forgiveness of medical debt, both here in the United States and at the Moravian medical ministry in Ahuas, Honduras. The Debt Jubilee Project: For the Healing of the World was a collaborative effort of several Moravian agencies based on our biblical call to care for the sick and our belief that healthcare is a fundamental human right. We are pleased to share that this project is making a huge impact around the world and at home.

Total Amount Received: \$102, 424.47 (More than double our goal!)

Total sent to the Ahuas Clinic in Honduras: \$25,606.12

Total sent to abolish medical debt in the U.S.: \$76,818.35.

Total debt abolished in the U.S.: \$10,965,390.60.

People impacted: 13,441 individuals / families in 37 counties across 15 states where Moravian congregations / entities are located.

Local Impact: \$2,172,360.22 medical debt was eliminated in Pennsylvania. 2,478 families and individuals right here in our state recently received a letter notifying them that their debt was forgiven, with no further action required. Putting this in perspective: When all is said and done, the number of people impacted by the Debt Jubilee Project will be equivalent to one in every five people living in Bethlehem (75,624). A huge success!
